

Photo Hunt

What you need:

1. 1 camera (on phone with a camera) per group
 2. List of objects to find and photograph per group
(Note: Before doing this activity, look through the list below and personalize it for your Elac centre as it may not be possible to take photos of some of the objects/situations on the list below. You may also need to adjust the length of the list depending on your students).
 3. Group register
 4. Risk assessment (indoor/outdoor activity)
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Stage 1

Take a register of your group to establish that everyone is present. Make a note of any absentees and make sure you tell the Activity Manager at the end of the session.

Stage 2

Divide students into groups of 5 students (or less) each. Try to make sure that each group is mixed in terms of nationality, sex, age and English ability as much as possible.

Stage 3

Explain the task to the students; that they will be given a piece of paper with a list of objects/situations on it. They must find ALL of the objects and photograph them.

Rules:

1. Only ONE camera/phone camera can be used per group.
2. All the members of the group (except the group leader who will take the photos) must be present in EACH photograph along with the object(s)/situations they are taking a photo of.
3. It is not necessary to take the photos in order.
4. When you have completed the activity, you should come to the Elac office as quickly as possible where an Activity Leader will check your photos. The team who has completed the task successfully first will win a prize.

Ask the students questions to check the students have understood what they have to do e.g. Ask them: How many cameras can each group use? How many of your group has to be in each photo? Do you have to take the photos in the order they are on the list? etc.

Stage 4

Give each group leader the Photo Hunt list and a pen. Ask them to start by writing the names of their whole group CLEARLY on the back of the list.

Start the activity!

At the end of the activity, remember to tell the activity Manager the names of the winning group so they can organize prizes/certificates for the end of course talent show/awards ceremony.

Activity leader, remember!

1. Keep language simple. Some students may not understand complex instructions. If it's important use concept questions and repeat it.
2. Your job is to motivate and organize. Make sure that you are proactive and encouraging.
3. Keep calm, don't lose your patience (with students or group leaders) and have fun.
